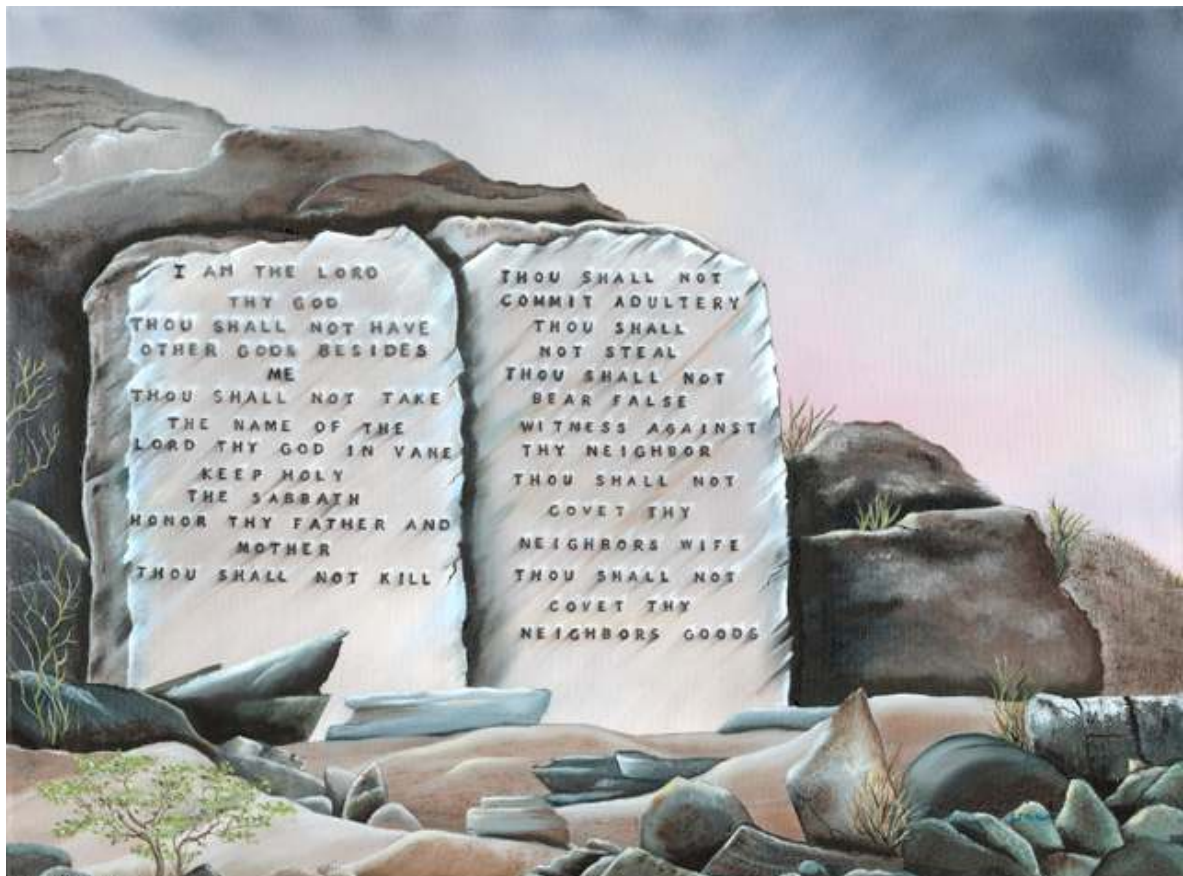
The Ten Commandments are like an "owner's manual" for our humanity. Far from being arbitrary or outdated, they are God's way of helping us know how we should live so as to attain true happiness and fulfill the purpose of our existence. What they teach can be known, however imperfectly, by reason. They universally apply to people of all times and places.

Jesus Christ reaffirmed the truth of the Ten Commandments not only by what he said and did but also by his very identity as the eternal Son of God. By assuming our human nature and becoming one of us, he revealed the Father's love. He revealed us to ourselves and showed us who we truly are in the sight of God. The commandments are thus crucial not only in our human development, but also in our response to the many ways God calls us to share his life and love.

## **'I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD'**

Asked by a young man how to attain eternal life, Jesus told him to keep the commandments and then to follow him ([see Mt 19:17, 21](#)). We can "rediscover" the truth and permanent validity of the commandments by reflecting on how perfectly Jesus showed their fullest meaning (*Compendium*, 434). In Jesus, the good teacher, the commandments are summed up in loving the Lord with all one's being and loving one's neighbor as oneself.

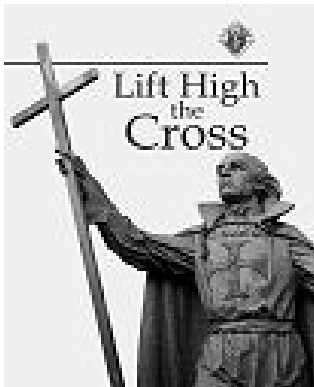

## *Open Meeting*



Eagle Scout Derek Nunes made a presentation of his project, 2 stone monuments at the church entrance. The monuments would consist of 2 layers of stones about 60 ft. round. ## *NEW BUSINESS*


- E-mail from Cary McIntosh, parish staff, stating the power system back-up system needs new batteries to meet city code. Initial estimate \$11,000, 2<sup>nd</sup> estimated cost \$5800. A. Hayles offered \$3000 from the Youth Group. Cary is requesting that the knights and ladies auxiliary donate \$1400 each. Council members are very upset that monies for church maintenance items be taken from the Youth Group. Comments from D. Adams and other knowledgeable members question doing this as in their opinion the backup system is very marginal and should be replaced. To meet code the motion made **“Council to donate \$1400 for backup battery system.”** Motion 2<sup>nd</sup>, and passed. The Grand Knight was requested to submit a letter with the check stating the councils displeasure with a). Taking monies from the Youth and b). The lack of proper financial planning for replacement items in the church. Also, it was suggested that a member(s) of the parish finance committee come before the next council meeting to advise on the lack of financial planning.
