



- Is Jazz in the Woods a FREE event? YES.
- Are tickets required for admittance? NO.
- What type of music will be at the event? Jazz In The Woods offers a variety of music every year. In the past, we have had Traditional Jazz, Ragtime, Zydeco, Fusion Jazz, Smooth Jazz, Contemporary Jazz, Blues, Latin Jazz just to give you an example. We hope you will come out and experience our event.
- Are children welcome? YES, this is a family event. Kids Pavilion area sponsored by Renewal by Andersen and PNC Real Estate! Includes children's crafts, face painting by Sister Act Face Painting and inflatable's provided by Action Inflatables!
- Who organizes Jazz in the Woods? The Overland Park South Rotary Club.
- Can we bring a cooler? Food and beverages (including alcohol) will be available for purchase at the festival. NO FOOD OR DRINKS, PETS OR OUTDOOR FLAME IS ALLOWED AT THE EVENT. This updated policy will be enforced for 2011.
- What is Jazz in the Woods? An annual Jazz and music festival to raise money for local children's charities..
- When & Where is Jazz in the Woods? June 24 & 25 2011 at Corporate Woods in Overland Park, KS.
- What time does the festival start? On Friday night the jazz talent starts at 6:30 PM and goes to 11:00 PM. On Saturday night the jazz talent starts at 5:15 PM and goes to 11:00 PM.
 - Is there food at Jazz in the Woods? Yes, several food and beverage vendors participate during the event.
